## A Fresh Start For Cape Cod Children

A donation of \$2,265 and 2 backpacks from members and from the Guild was made to Falmouth Ser-



vice Center Fresh Start program. This donation helped with the purchase of backpacks and school supplies. Mashpee and Falmouth children are eligible for this program.

This year backpacks were filled for 154 children—grades K-12, seven schools

in Falmouth each receive eight filled backpacks for any needy child whose family has not heard of our program. The distribution of these backpacks is determined by the School Adjustment Counselor. In addition we anticipate 60 which will be given out to late registrants and 30 will go to Cape Cod Air Base. This brings the total to 300.

To all who made contributions, whether large or small, many thanks. Each year at this time, I find myself in awe of your generosity. Give yourselves a big pat on the back. You deserve it.

# A Look Ahead: Fall Program Planning



What new and exciting techniques are we going to learn at our meetings this fall? What new insights about design will we gain? Here's a quick preview of the plans that Program Chairs Deborah Winograd and Conny Doty have for us in the months ahead:

<u>September 14.</u> Our welcome-back meeting will include an extensive Show and Tell of the quilts, wall hangings, and other projects that we have completed this summer. A special feature will be a look at the quilts that were entered in the Barnstable County Fair and recognition of the ribbon winners.

<u>September 28</u>. Ruth Wilcox is an art quilter who lives in West Barnstable; she works and teaches at Tumbleweed Quilt Shop. She has an art degree from Rhode Island School of Design & makes art quilts that include salvaged fabric and notions and a number of interesting techniques. <u>October 12</u>. Christine Meyers provides an introduction to the techniques of long-arm quilting and will be vending fabrics from her shop, the Quilt Corner Studio,

<u>October 19</u>. Full-day workshop with Heidi Proffetty on making mosaic tiles with fabric. More information will be available at the first meeting.

<u>October 26</u>. Our own Penny Bartlett explains and demonstrates how to use the Guild's AccuCutter and its dies to facilitate your quilting by speeding up the process of marking and cutting.

<u>November 9</u>. Ways & Means will be a fabric tag sale this year. Fabric will be sold in individual pieces priced by size. Please bring in the fabric you will donate before the November 9 meeting so we can measure and price it. Patterns, notions, and books are also welcome.

<u>December 14</u>. Time to be of good cheer as the holidays approach! It's our annual holiday party, with lots of goodies and companionship.

# Scenes from the Barnstable County Fair, 2023

According to the Cape Cod Fairgrounds website, the Barnstable County Fair brings together "[s]izzling entertainment, thrilling rides, fabulous food, animals, agriculture and the world's largest Demolition Derby converge for seven days each July." But many of us are willing to forgo the Demolition Derby and the fried Twinkies to spend more time at the quilt exhibit where quilters from all over the Cape show off their best efforts and, sometimes, come home with ribbons. A dinner for volunteers was held after the fair closed to thank them, and many of our members attended.
